Please note the following regarding this Bible reading plan, which covers the entire Bible in one year:

- The plan does not stipulate readings for each day but for each month. Readers thereby have the freedom to read as much as each day allows or as the Spirit leads, although there are suggested numbers of days to spend in each section.
- The amount of reading for each month was calculated according to pages (not chapters) so that in each month approximately the same number of pages is assigned.
- The Old Testament readings are organized according to the Hebrew canonical order (cf. Matthew 23:35; Luke 11:51; 24:44), with the Law and Prophets being read alongside the Writings.
- The New Testaments readings alternate between the Gospels (and Acts), Paul's letters, and the General Epistles, with the latter two presented in roughly chronological order.
